





### Common Guidelines

- Available only to nonprofits and tribes
- Site control (ownership of property or 15+ year lease)
- Reimbursement only no advance payments
- Archaeological review
- Prevailing wages
- High-performance building standards (LEED)





# • Allowable Uses

- A&E
- Permitting and fees
- Demolition and site preparation
- Capitalized equipment
- IT infrastructure
- Landscaping



# • Ineligible Costs

- Internal administration
- Project management
- Fundraising activities
- Feasibility studies
- Computers
- Rolling stock
- Moving costs



### • Grant Process Timeline

- Applications available April June, 2022
- Applications due May July, 2022
- Advisory Board review July August 2022
- Lists submitted to Governor September, 2022
- 2021 2023 Capital Budget signed May, 2023

  - \$127 million awarded since 1991
  - Grants up to \$2 million per project
  - \$12 million cap
  - Match up to 20%



#### **Edmonds Waterfront Center**

- Award \$2,200,000
- Providing seniors with health services and a community space for recreational and educational programs



- Youth Recreational Facilities
- Beth Robinson Program Manager
  - Indoor recreation with an education and/or social service component
  - \$52 million awarded since 2005
  - Grants up to \$1.2 million
  - Match capital costs up to 25%

- Award \$500,000

- Expanded room for youth activities and programs
- Award \$515,000

#### **Colby Avenue Youth Center Everett**

- Drop in day center for homeless youth
- Award \$438,000
- Funded construction of kitchen, offices and music room
